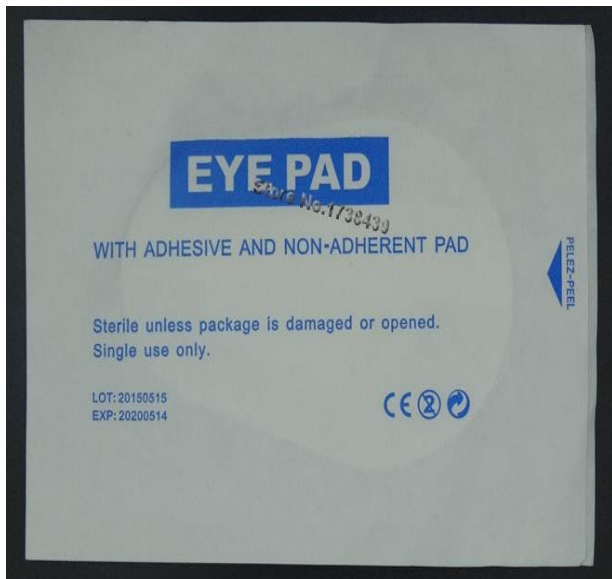

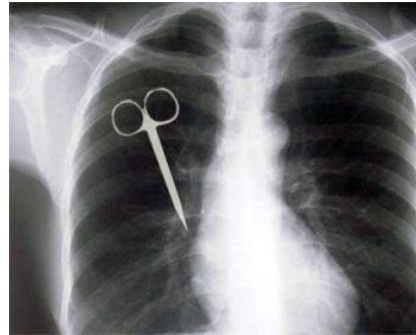

- If 99.9% were good enough...
 - Major plane crash every 3 days
 - 12 babies given to wrong parents every day
 - 37,000 ATM errors every hour

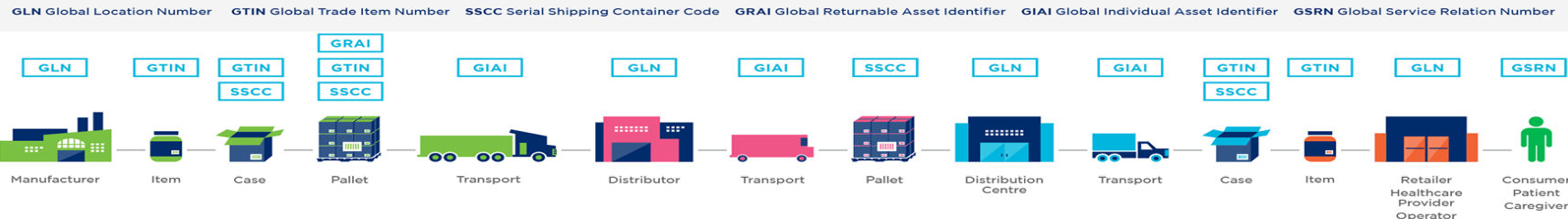

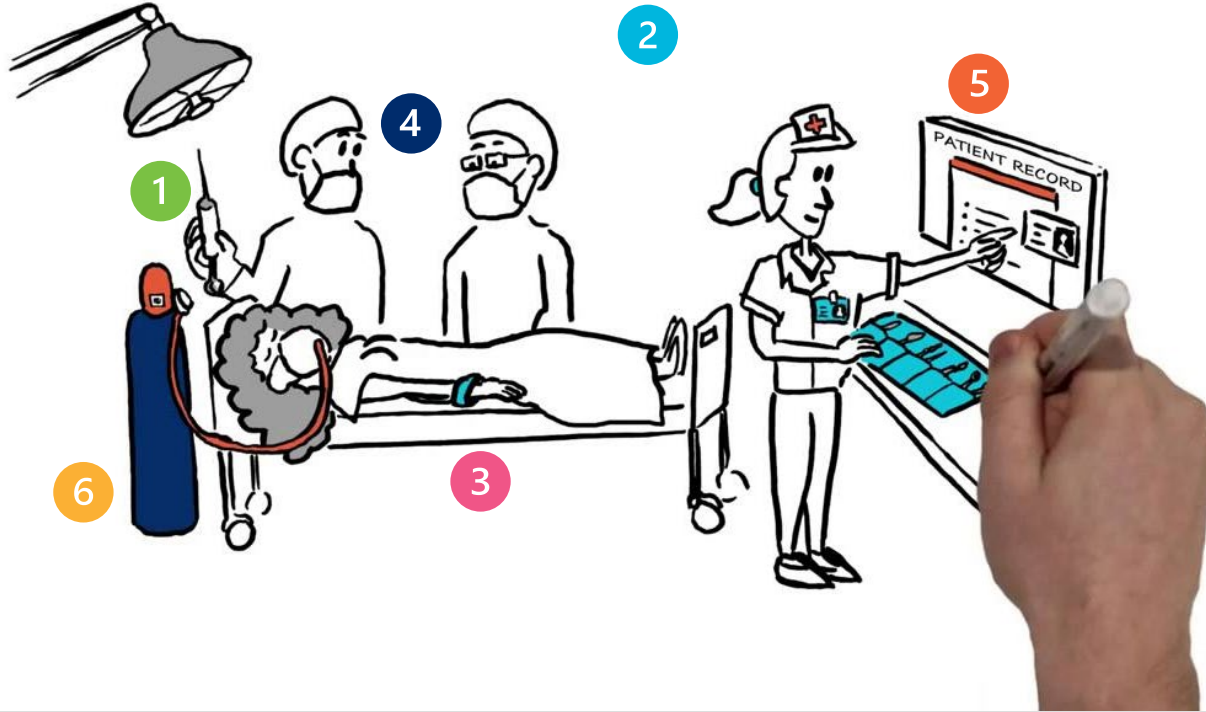

The Scan4Safety journey so far




Lord Carter's Interim report in 2015 finds that the *"introduction of GS1 standards will allow every NHS hospital in England to save on average up to £3 million each year while improving patient care."*

In September 2017, Derby Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust becomes the **first Trust to complete all four phases of Scan4Safety**

In 2014, the Department of Health mandated the use of GS1 standards within the **eProcurement strategy**

In January 2016, six NHS Trusts are being fully-funded by the Department of Health to become **demonstrator sites of excellence**

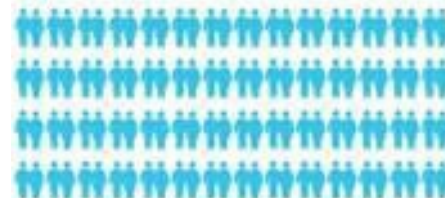

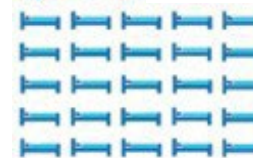

Patient Safety

- Making sure you have the Right Patient
- Making sure you (always) know What Product was used with Which Patient, When
- Making sure you have What You Need, When You Need it and Where You Need it
- Real time tracking of patients and bed state management 24/7
- Product recall
- Preventing the use of expired stock



Board Level Support



Patient Identification (GSRN)

- Wristbands Printers in situ across all 7 hospitals in 140 clinical areas
- 163 wristband printers rolled out
- 100% of all inpatients have Scan4Safety wristband
- 100% of A&E wristbands are GS1 compliant
- The Trust can only generate GS1 compliant wristbands regardless of patient age or admission method



Global Location Numbers (GLNs)

- To ensure supplies can be traced & delivered to any area we have assigned:
24,303 GLNs to physical locations in the Trust
1,346 functional GLNs to wards and departments
- GLNs are being used in Pan-European Public Procurement Online (PEPPOL) transactions
- Identified how to use a 2D data matrix to define bed spaces using GLN Extensions

Product Recall (GTIN's)

“Out of date products will become a thing of the past”

- Scanning patient wristband to associate the **right product** in the **right place**
- **Reducing error**, including never events
- **Safe, appropriate** stock levels
- **Expiry date** reporting / alerts
- **Patient level costings** in keys areas, informing clinical decisions
- Improved **product recall** processes, automatically tracking products to patients

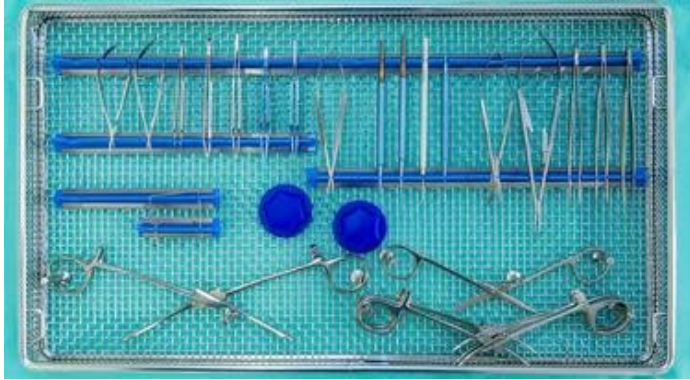

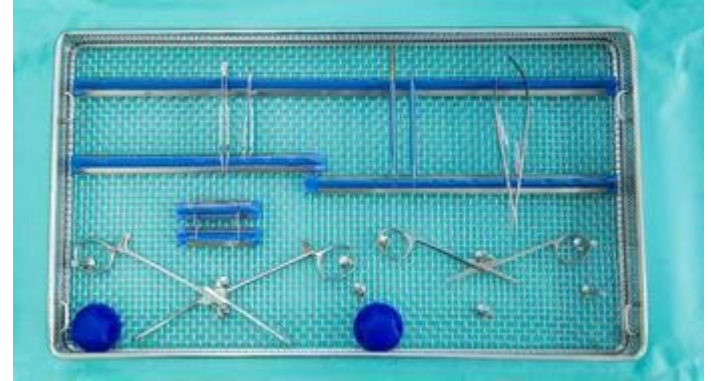

Initial Analysis – Cost vs Tariff

High volume non complex HRG

(EA54Z Percutaneous Standard Ablation)

- Assumed mean procedure time of 79 mins for costings
- Cost £1,821
- Income £1,820
- Loss 0.84p per patient

Actual Procedure Time (mean): 133 minutes Actual loss £808 per patient

FYE: circa £153,300

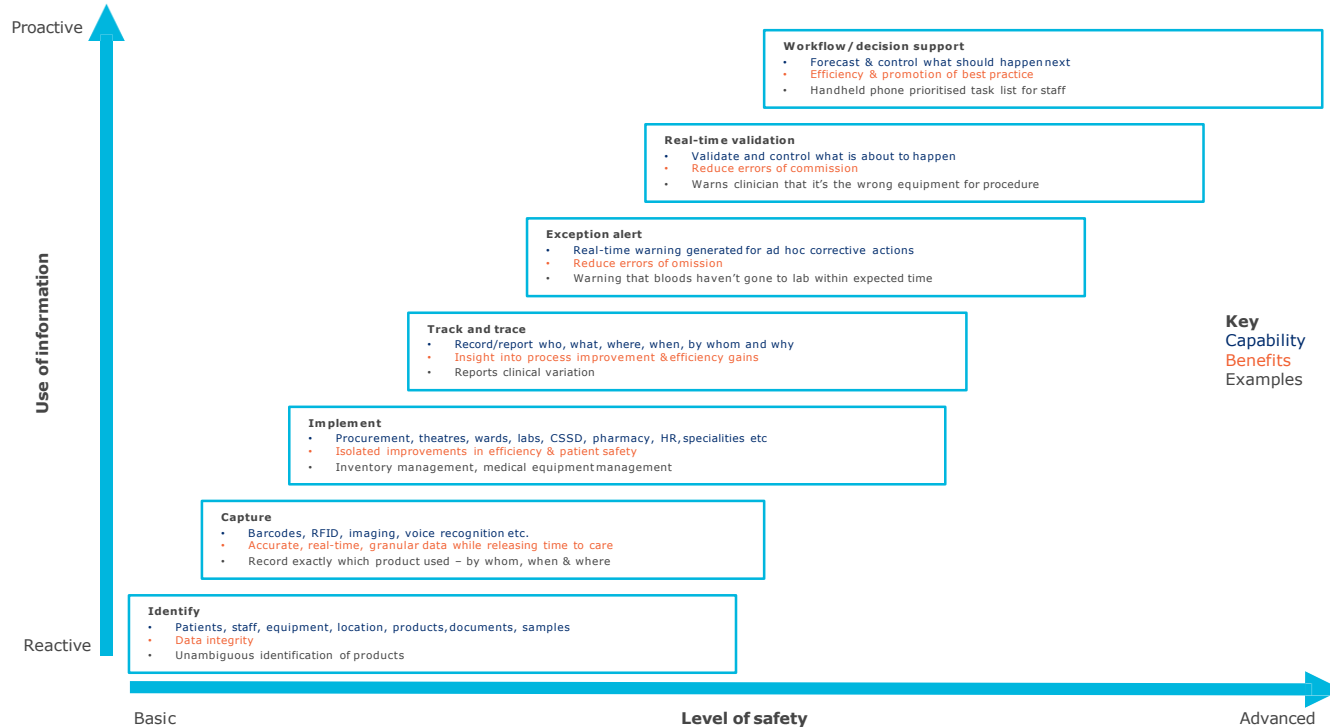

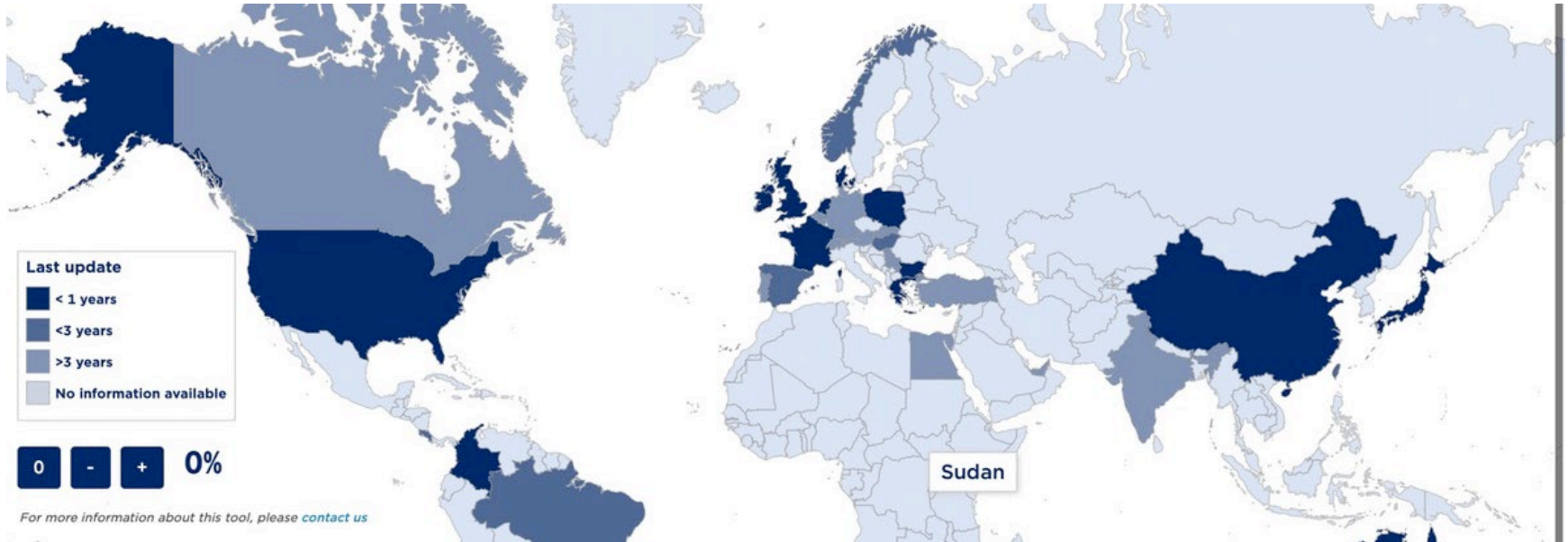

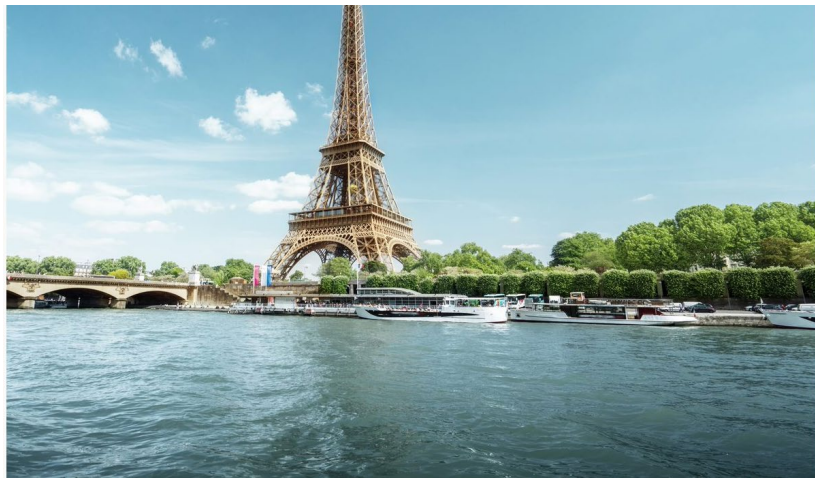
